## JAPAN in Autumn

21 DAVS From the hi-tech speed and efficiency of the bullet train to the serenity of Kyoto's Zen gardens and temples, Japan offers a unique mix of the modern and the traditional. This tour includes the best of everything Japan has to offer. It is designed for newcomers to Japan and follows a leisurely pace starting and ending in Tokyo. Autumn is a wonderful time to visit Japan. The changing colours of the leaves throughout the landscape can be mesmerising. Blue Dot's engaged style of travel means that we will give you every opportunity to meet Japanese people and to do as the Japanese do. The first thing you'll notice about the locals is how polite they are. The second thing you'll notice is that English is not commonly spoken or understood and as a result, there is a lot of bowing and smiling without many words being spoken. Practice your "Ohay gozaimasu" (good morning) and "konichiwa" (good afternoon) as it will go a long way. We'll start and finish in Tokyo giving you ample time to enjoy this modern

metropolis, a city of pulsating energy. In between you'll have the chance to experience the many different aspects which make Japan such a unique and fascinating country – including some lesser travelled destinations.





14 DAYS Very few western travellers visit the Tohuku region, so the experience is akin to visiting Japan 30 years ago before tourism exploded in the major cities. We'll visit small traditional villages like the mountainous hot spring village of Nyuto Onsen, with its collection of rustic wooden buildings and Ouchi-juku, a collection of traditional thatched buildings from the Edo Period, both



dating back 300 years. This region is rich in Samurai history and we'll visit authentic samurai residences where the direct descendants of the samurai families still live. It is also home to some of Japan's original castles with excellent examples Hirosaki and Tsuruga.

As one of the least densely populated areas of Japan, Tohoku is known for its beautiful mountainous scenery, virgin beech forests, volcanic peaks and lakes. We'll enjoy gentle hiking at Goshikinuma, a cluster of five volcanic lakes, each with its unique colour ranging from reddish-green to cobalt blue; and at Shirakami Sanchi, the largest virgin beech forest in East Asia, and a UNESCO listed area.



On our travels, we'll stay in a mix of hotels and traditional Ryokans, some with naturally occurring hot spring baths on site. Come and join us for a step away from modern life, to wander amongst breathtaking natural beauty and to gain a fantastic insight into Japanese history, culture and traditional customs.

## Stunning NOV 2022 & 2023 SRI LANKA

**15 DAYS** Sri Lanka is an islandnation in the Indian Ocean separated from India by the Palk Straight. It is "almost" linked to India by a mostly underwater atoll called Adam's Bridge. It is a very lush, tropical island sitting just north of the equator. For over 2,000 years the island was ruled by a monarchy which only ceased in 1972 with the appointment of a president. Sri Lanka's population of around

22 million – similar to our own – is multi ethnic with four main groups. Singhalese (mostly Buddhist) is the largest, followed by Tamils (mostly Hindu), Moors (with Arab origins) and Burghers – a mixed group of Portuguese and Dutch origin who are mainly Christians.

Generally speaking, it is a poor country but tourism is helping to change that. Apart from the tourist industry, its core source of income comes from tea exportations, spices, rubber textiles and petroleum refining. About 30% of the island is covered by forest and about 10% of this is national park.



There are so many reasons to visit this country – there is so much to see and do. Even though it is a relatively small country, each region is quite different. The indigenous and colonial history is fascinating. The food is fabulous. The scenery is spectacular. Plus, the abundance of wildlife – one of the draw-cards for travellers – will take you by surprise. Visiting the national parks – and sometimes in the wild – you may spot sambar deer, Sri Lankan elephants, leopards, sloth bears, crocodiles, water buffalo and hundreds of birds species. It's no wonder that a few years back, Lonely Planet rated this wonderful country as the "hottest travel destination on the planet", and they didn't mean the weather! Grab your camera and join us.

**THE CAUCASUS** Georgia, Azerbaijan, & Armenia

25 DAVS Snow-capped mountains dominate the region and make for beautiful views with hilltop villages and green valleys. Georgia has an ancient culture and a unique alphabet found nowhere else in the world. The capital, Tbilisi will surprise you with its modern, very European café style society. Yet, leave the city and you may feel like you are travelling in medieval times. Tourists (not that there are that many) visit mainly for the scenic beauty of the higher Caucasus Mountain range, the highest point of which is over 5,000 metres.

Azerbaijan, considered a moderate Muslim nation, also boasts an ancient culture with a history dating back to prehistoric times. Stone-age settlements are still evident. Most neighbours came, made their mark and then left at some stage. For many years, her economy has been based around the abundance of oil and gas reserves. The capital, Baku, could be considered a dynamic city.

The Republic of Armenia, a landlocked country in the Lower Caucasus, is a very small country at less than half the size of our own Tasmania and with a population of less than 3 million. Like Georgia, it is a Christian country with an ancient history. Armenia has the distinction of having the oldest Christian cathedral in the world! Tourism is growing as infrastructure & services improve. The countryside is beautiful with the jewel being the Alpine Lake Sevan at almost 2,000m above sea level – one of the largest freshwater alpine lakes in the world. These three countries should be high on your list of must-see destinations.

Algeria is one of the most fascinating countries in North Africa. It was colonised by just about



everyone in the region until the French laid hands stretching her colonial empire. On this tour you'll visit Tipaza, with its ruins of a Phoenician trading post, Roman port and Byzantine churches. We will see the wellpreserved Roman cities of Timgad and Djémila which provide insight into sophisticated urban living in the wealthiest of imperial Roman provinces. With the Sahara as a backdrop, the ancient Ksars or fortified strongholds, with their surrounding mud brick villages still hold on to traditions that have endured the desert sands for centuries.

In contrast, Tunisia is a small but diverse country, that lies across the Mediterranean Sea from Sicily. First settled by the Berber tribes, Tunisia like Algeria, has hosted several cultures. Your tour starts at the ancient city of Carthage, founded by the Phoenicians in the tenth century BCE. Following its destruction in 146 BCE, Rome re-established the city, which grew to a peak population of 500,000. You'll visit Berber oasis villages with distinctive troglodyte houses, Roman cities with fine imperial monuments like el Djem's huge amphitheatre, museums with magnificent antique mosaics, and beautiful Islamic buildings constructed over 1,500 years. You'll encounter the fascinating ribats of Sousse and Monastir, built to defend from European incursions.

### Incredible Southern Southern India

Its wide-open spaces make for a verdant and fertile backdrop to the region's diverse history, landscapes and people. Be immersed in the South's ancient, medieval and more recent colonial history; visit small villages, larger townships and even larger cities. Observe locals as they go about their day and welcome you with a wide smile. See a plethora of wildlife in world-class Nagarhole National Park, de-stress while cruising the tranquil backwaters of Kerala on a slow but majestic houseboat. If you appreciate your food, the dishes from this part of the world are outstanding, comprised of many different cuisines from the various areas of Southern India.

Each and every day brings its own magic but the "highlights" include the surreal houseboat experience on the tranquil backwaters of Kerala,


