



wildlife and fauna, and magnificent scenery embracing every landform from high mountain plateaus to parched deserts, Ethiopia is a destination without peer. Add to this one of the finest climates in Africa ("thirteen months of sunshine!") and you have so many reasons to visit this incredible country.

Located in the northeast Horn of Africa, Ethiopia is the oldest nation in Africa. A country with one of the richest histories on the African continent, Ethiopia has extraordinary archaeological sites. In the North of the country are the seventeenth-century castles and the Imperial Compound of Gondar, the monasteries of Lake Tana and the thirteenth-century monolithic rock-hewn churches of King Lalibela in the Wollo Region — the Eighth Wonder of the World. In the East, the 1000-year-old city of Harar, with its 99 Mosques, is the fourth holiest city in Islam, after Mecca, Medina and Jerusalem.

Ethiopia is one of the largest countries in Sub-Saharan Africa, covering

over one million square kilometres. It has a variety of scenery, from the peaks of the Simien Mountains in the north to the deep Dalol depression in the west. The landscape is dominated by a volcanically formed central plateau, referred to as the Ethiopian Highlands, with an average altitude of 2,000 metres, including twenty peaks of 4,000 metres or higher. These Highlands form the source of four major river systems, the best known being the Blue Nile, which rises in Lake Tana in the northwest.

No trip to Ethiopia is complete without witnessing the remarkable Timkat ceremonies, celebrating the Baptism of Jesus. The colours are nothing short of spectacular, and it ranks as one of the world's greatest street festivals.





THE 5 STANS of Central Asia

29 DAYS Central Asia, or "The Stans" as the region is known to we Westerners, is a vast land-locked region of Asia, ideal for travellers who want to experience one of the world's last great frontier lands. In Stalin's time, the area was known as Turkestan. Soon after Independence, these former Soviet Central Asian Republics, Turkmenistan, Uzbekistan, Kyrgyzstan, Kazakhstan and Tajikistan were defined as Central Asia. The Silk Road gave rise to unprecedented trade. Its brilliance and unique place in human history resulted from the interchange of ideas, innovations and philosophies amongst the very different peoples that used it. Our travels will encompass many historic places and other "story-book" destinations.

Wonderful monuments, some restored, some not; museums full of ancient artifacts; colourful bazaars, all combined with stunning landscapes, make this a memorable experience.

Uzbekistan has three standout historical places of interest – Samarkand, Bukhara and Khiva. All three are very special in their own way, and no trip to Uzbekistan is complete without seeing their mosques, colourful markets and city squares.

Turkmenistan is a wonderful mix of old and new. The ancient ruins of Merv & Nisa contrast the glistening streets of the ultra-modern capital Ashgabat.

The countryside of **Kyrgyzstan** is like a postcard at every turn. Snowcapped mountains with bright green fields in the foreground, yurts dotting the countryside, lakes, rivers and picturesque townships.

Kazakhstan is the world's ninthbiggest country and the most

developed in the region. The capital, Almaty, retains a distinctly Russian feel and is a wonderful city to stroll and explore.

Tajikistan sits at the "roof of the world", high in the Pamir Mountain range. Its fascinating historical landscape is shaped by various civilisations that have left their mark, including Greek, Buddhist, Hindu, Zoroastrian and Islamic. With pockets of our itinerary rarely visited by tourists, you'll find warm and interested local people all along the way. Prepare your camera and your curiosity for this fascinating journey through history.








THE CAUCASUS

Azerbaijan, Georgia & Armenia



Azerbaijan is a country boasting a history that dates back to prehistoric times and evidence of stone-age settlements. From the dynamic capital city of Baku to charming villages filled with stone buildings and cobblestone streets, to the ancient city Sheki, it is a country of contrasts. Azerbaijan was an important part of the Great Silk Route, and nowadays its economy is based on the abundance of oil and gas reserves. It is home to the UNESCO World Heritage-listed rock art site Gobustan and is the birthplace of the ancient Zoroastrian religion.

Georgia has an ancient culture and a unique alphabet found nowhere else in the world. Over the centuries all her neighbours have coveted over her land. Turks, Persians, Mongols, Arabia and the Russians have invaded and periodical

civil war has also left its mark. But nowadays, it is a peaceful country becoming known for its quality wines and spectacular scenery. The capital, Tbilisi, has a modern European vibe, with cosy cafes, art galleries and theatres. Yet, leave the city and it may feel like travelling in medieval times, amongst palaces, castles, fortresses and rock-hewn villages. The UNESCO World Heritage-listed ancient capital Mtskheta sits at the confluence of the Aragvi River, and its 11th-century Svetitskhoveli Cathedral is where Christ's robe was buried.

Armenia is a very small country at less than half the size of our own Tasmania and with a population of less than 3 million. Once a part of the Soviet Union, independence was reclaimed in 1991. It is a very "indigenous" country with 98% of the population being and speaking Armenian. Tourism is growing as infrastructure and services improve. Like Georgia, the countryside is beautiful with the jewel being the alpine Lake Sevan at almost 2,000 metres above sea level — one of the largest freshwater alpine lakes in the world.


STUNNING SCANDINAVIA Lapland, Finland, Sweden & Norway

Oman is an independent sultanate on the Arabian peninsula. Covering a strategic location on the Arabian Sea, it was coveted by the great powers which came and went. In the late 1400's, the Portuguese occupied much of the territory, including the capital, Muscat. Almost 100 years later, The Ottomans drove them out and occupied the region for some 100 years. The Persians also came and went briefly. Since 1741, it has been selfgoverning. The country occupies just over 300,000 square km and has a population of over 4 million, with the overwhelming majority being of the Islamic faith. Oman is famous for breeding its Arabian horses. Muscat, Oman's port capital, sits on the Gulf of Oman, which is surrounded by mountains and desert. With a history dating back to antiquity, it mixes high-rises and upscale shopping malls with clifftop landmarks such as the 16th-century Portuguese forts, Al Jalali and Mirani, looming over Muscat Harbour. Its modern, marble-clad Sultan Qaboos Grand Mosque, with 50m dome and prodigious Persian carpet, can accommodate 20,000 people.

Amongst the rock-hewn splendours of Madain Saleh, you can find Nabatean treasures on par with those at Petra. At the same time, the mud-brick ruins of Diriyah provide a fascinating insight into the origins of the Saud Dynasty. The mountains of the southwest are home to a surprising collection of traditional villages that still evoke echoes of the past, whilst the haunting ruins of Al Ula provide a chance to explore one of the most impressive ghost towns anywhere in the Middle East.



18 DAYS Mexico is the world's largest Spanish-speaking country, and with around 130 million people, it ranks as the 11th most populous nation.

Pre-Colombian Mexico dates to about 8,000 BC and is identified as one of five cradles of civilisation. It was home to many advanced Mesoamerican civilisations such as the Olmec, Toltec, Teotihuacan, Zapotec, Mayan, and Aztec people. The first contact with Europeans was in the early 16th century. In 1521, the Spanish Empire conquered and colonised the territory from its politically powerful base in Mexico-Tenochtitlan (part of Mexico City). Three centuries later, the territory became a nationstate following its recognition in 1821 after the Mexican War of Independence.

Mexicans are some of the friendliest people you'll ever meet, and they are usually eager to share their wealth of history and abundant culture with travellers from other countries.

Our tour of Mexico starts in Mexico City and then moves southeast, taking in the UNESCO heritage sites of Monte Alban, the greatest of the Zapotec cities, Teotihuacan, the most sacred of the Aztec sites and the Mayan sites of Palengue, Uxmal and Chichen Itza. After travelling through the heartland, we will savour some wonderful Mexican food and music and reach the Yucatan Peninsula on the Caribbean coast.

Cuba is an archipelago of islands in the Caribbean. The island of Cuba is by far the largest, at approximately 110,000 square kilometres.
