

ANCIENT WONDERS OF THE NILE 12 NIGHT LUXURY RIVER CRUISE


Despite sitting adjacent to two large bodies of water – the Red Sea and the Mediterranean – Egypt is almost entirely a desert environment, except for areas along the Nile, the world's longest river. Cairo, the country's capital with a population of over 22 million, has a fascinating history and was initially settled in 973 CE by the Fatimid Islamic sect. Its name means "the triumphant city". Of course, history predates this, with the famous pyramids built between 4,000 and 5,000 years ago.

Egypt has numerous archaeological sites of major significance, including the Valley of the Kings, the burial place of the kingdom's pharaohs. The Pyramids of Giza need little introduction, sitting on the outskirts of Cairo. They are burial grounds for generations of pharaohs. Luxor Temple is a large complex located on the east bank of the Nile River in the city today known as Luxor, and was constructed approximately 1400 BCE. The list goes on!

The country is highly indigenous in that 98% of all people, around 110 million, are original Egyptians, with the vast majority being Sunni Muslims. Arabic forms the primary language; however, literacy is very low compared to the developed world. Sadly, women lag way behind men, with about 40% of the country's women considered to be illiterate.

Day 1, Monday 6th April BOARD VESSEL AND DEPART

Today, we will be transferred from the hotel to the Aswan Cruise Port.

Embarkation for the cruise and overnight. Dinner is on board, accompanied by welcome drinks and music in the bar. *B/D*



Day 2, Tuesday 7th April HIGH DAM AND NUBIAN MUSEUM

Breakfast onboard, followed by a walking tour of the High Dam and Philae Temple. A monumental structure completed in 1970, the High Dam is one of the world's largest dams. This engineering marvel is crucial in controlling the Nile's annual flooding, providing hydroelectric power, and facilitating agricultural development. Afterwards, you'll enjoy a short motorboat ride to visit the majestic Philae Temple on the Island of Agilka. The entire temple was flooded when the High Dam was built and was moved stone by stone to a new island, specially landscaped to resemble

the original structure. Lunch is on board, and then our Egyptologist guide will take us to the Nubian Museum. The museum offers a fascinating exploration of



Nubian history and culture. It features artefacts from various periods, including statues, pottery, and jewellery, showcasing the region's ancient civilisations and their interactions with others. The museum also highlights the archaeological efforts undertaken during the construction of the Aswan High Dam, which helped preserve many Nubian monuments. Tonight, there is a



manager's cocktail party, before we enjoy dinner on board with a Nubian Show. Overnight in Aswan. *B/L/D*

Day 3, Wednesday 8th April ASWAN – KOM OMBO – EDFU

This morning, we'll sail from Aswan to Kom Ombo. Enjoy the countryside view and watch the



locals go about their day. Late in the afternoon, we'll visit Kom Ombo Temple, uniquely dedicated to the crocodile god Sobek and the falcon god Haroeris (Horus

the Elder). The name "Kom Ombo" combines the Arabic "kum" (mound) and "Ombo" from the ancient Egyptian "Nubt" (the golden city). Built during the Graeco-Roman Period (332 BC–395 AD) on an older New Kingdom site, the temple features two parallel passages leading to sanctuaries for each deity. Walking through the temple, you'll see beautiful column capitals and detailed wall scenes depicting festivals, rituals, and surgical instruments from the 2nd century AD. Overnight in Edfu. *B/L/D*

sanctuaries dedicated to the falcon god Horus. Located on the west bank of the Nile, this magnificent Ptolemaic temple was constructed between 237 and 57 BC. Its grand entrance, towering columns, and intricate hieroglyphs depicting Horus's victory over Seth are extraordinary. The temple also features a unique Nilometer, an ancient device used to measure the Nile's water level. Visiting the Edfu Temple offers a fascinating glimpse into ancient Egyptian religion, architecture, and daily life. Overnight in Luxor. *B/L/D*

Day 5, Friday 10th April LUXOR


This morning, we'll visit the West Bank Valley of Kings and Hatshepsut Temple for an



unforgettable journey into ancient history. The Hatshepsut Temple, also known as Djeser-Djeseru, is a stunning mortuary built for Queen Hatshepsut, one of Egypt's few female pharaohs. Nestled against the cliffs of Deir el-Bahari, the temple features grand terraces, impressive colonnades, and intricate reliefs depicting Hatshepsut's reign and divine birth. Afterwards, we will head to the nearby Valley of the Kings. the royal burial ground of the New Kingdom pharaohs. Here, descend into the elaborately decorated tombs of famous pharaohs, including Tutankhamun, Ramses II, and Seti I. Each tomb offers a glimpse into the ancient Egyptian beliefs about the afterlife, with vivid wall paintings and intricate carvings. Visiting these iconic sites provides a captivating look into Egypt's rich history, architecture, and cultural heritage. Lunch is back on board before visiting the East Bank (Karnak and Luxor Temples). We'll next visit the Temple of Karnak, built over a thousand years ago by generations of Pharaohs, before continuing to the Temple of Luxor, which is dedicated to the God Amon. Overnight in Luxor. B/L/D

Day 6, Saturday 11th April LUXOR – NAGA HAMMADI

Enjoy a morning at leisure before visiting Dendera Temple in the



early afternoon, an exquisitely preserved complex dedicated to the goddess Hathor. This Ptolemaic temple near Luxor features impressive columns, detailed reliefs, and the famous Dendera Zodiac. Explore the grand Hypostyle Hall, the rooftop chapels, and the sacred lake. Overnight in Naga Hammadi. *B/L/D*





Day 7, Sunday 12th April **NAGA** HAMMADI -SOHAG

This morning, visit the Abydos Temple, one of

Egypt's most significant archaeological sites. Dedicated to Osiris, the god of the afterlife, this ancient temple features stunning reliefs, detailed hieroglyphs, and the famed King List, which chronicles Egypt's pharaohs. Tonight, a wine tasting will be provided before dinner. After dinner, join the Galabeya Party. Overnight at Sohag. B/L/D



Day 8, Monday 13th April SOHAG -- TEL **EL AMARNA**

Today, the ship will sail from Sohag to Tel El Amarna, the

home of the Amarnian experience, via Asyout's lock. After lunch, take a boat ride to the Prince Tawdrous Monastery. There's a cooking class on board for those interested, followed by a BBQ dinner. Overnight Tel El Amarna. B/L/D



Day 9, Tuesday 14th April TEL EL AMARNA – MINYA

After breakfast, we'll visit the Northern Tombs of Tel El Amarna, the Royal Tomb of Akhenaten, the Northern Palace, and the Small Temples of Aten, where ancient Egyptian nobility lies. We'll conclude our journey with visits to the remarkable archaeological sites of Tuna El Gebel and Ashmunein. Tonight is an Italian feast followed by a folk show on board. Overnight in Minya. B/L/D



Day 10, Wednesday 15th April MINYA - BENI **SUIF**

Today, we embark on a captivating journey to Beni Hassan, a

treasure trove of ancient Egyptian wonders. Explore the awe-inspiring rock-cut tombs of noblemen adorned with vivid scenes of daily life and religious rituals. Marvel at the intricately painted hieroglyphs and vibrant murals that

glimpse the past. Later, we'll return to the ship for lunch and an afternoon at leisure, with a quiz tonight. Arrive and overnight in Beni Suif. B/L/D

Day 11, Thursday 16th April SAIL TO CAIRO

Enjoy the riverside views as we journey through Coptic Cairo, exploring its rich religious



heritage. Visit the iconic Hanging Church, known for its suspended nave and exquisite Coptic art. Explore the Coptic Museum, home to many Christian artefacts and manuscripts. Finally, delve into the history of the Jewish community at the Jewish Synagogue, where you can witness its ornate architecture and cultural significance. This tour offers a captivating glimpse into the diverse religious traditions of Cairo's ancient Coptic quarter. Tonight, a Takht (Oriental Music) performance. Overnight on board in Cairo. B/L/D

Day 12, Friday 17th April **GIZA PYRAMIDS AND SPHINX** After breakfast.

we'll visit the Giza Pyramids and the Sphinx, where we



will be exploring the iconic Giza Plateau. Enjoy viewing these magnificent structures with an expert guide who will provide commentary on their history and significance. For those interested, there are options to enter the Pyramids and the King's Chamber (at additional cost). Lunch will be served back on board before we step out again to visit the iconic Egyptian Museum, home to a breathtaking collection spanning 6,000 years of Egyptian civilisation. Some of the main attractions include the 3,200year-old, 11.36-metre (37ft) statue of King Ramses II, the complete collection of Tutankhamun's treasures and a 4,500-year-old boat, one of the oldest intact ships in the world, belonging to Khufu, the pharaoh renowned for building the Great Pyramid of Giza. Tonight, enjoy our final night on board the vessel. B/L/D
